## **“Beauty and Dignity in the Slums of India”**

**Enter a world rarely seen by tourists for an unforgettable experience of  
human kindness and self-respect.**

Marika Barnett was born in Budapest Hungary in 1934. At age twelve, her father gave her a Zeiss Ikon camera for her birthday and she says, “from that day on I photographed everywhere, everything and everybody”. She developed her photographic and artistic talents by studying and working in Europe, Hawaii and mainland USA.

Ms. Barnett’s photos have appeared on the covers of books, magazines and catalogs, have been exhibited in galleries nationwide and on several international exhibits. They can be found in private and corporate collections worldwide.
