## ***Assassinations***

The beloved and cherished Queen of the Hungarians, Elisabeth was stabbed to death in Geneva by a young Italian anarchist, Luigi Lucheni, on September 10, 1898. 3 years later and nearly 4000 miles away, William McKinley, the 25<sup>th</sup> President of the United States was fatally shot by a young American, Leon F. Czolgosz, on September 6, 1901. Though the two assassinations lack any proven link to one another, they show such stunning parallels that maybe even you would become suspicious: could it be that it was only a matter of coincidence or was there more to it? Judit Beke-Martos is currently a visiting scholar at Suffolk University Law School in Boston, Massachusetts while pursuing her PhD in comparative legal history. She graduated at Eötvös Loránd University's Faculty of Law and earned her LL.M at Suffolk. Throughout her studies she attended numerous conferences, gave talks and made presentations in Europe. She published in German and Hungarian, while her English language piece is due to be published soon. Her most recent research on the comparison of the two assassinations is an area which has not been explored before...
